









Remember these important points to make sure your next digging project is a safe one.

The owners of underground utility lines (telephone, cable TV, electric, gas, pipelines, sewer, traffic signals and water lines) will locate their utilities once they have been notified. Some service lines extending from the property easement to the house belong to the homeowner and are considered privately owned. If you have a question about who owns what, check with your utility company.

You or a private contractor will have to locate private service lines such as gas grill lines, water lines, sewer lines, electric service to your shop or garage, satellite dish cable or any other private services not owned by utility companies in your area.

If you hire a private contractor for excavation they are responsible for contacting Call OKIE prior to digging.

HOW IT WORKS

Step 1:

Always Call Okie at least two working days but no more than 10 days before digging. This excludes weekends or holidays. If you have an emergency call as soon as possible.



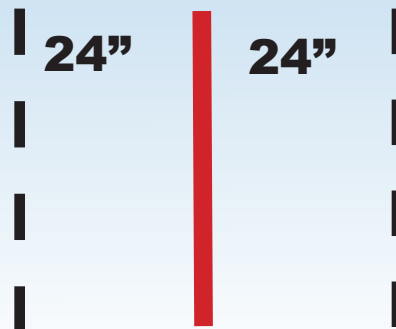
Step 2:

Wait for the site to be marked. Member utilities will mark the approximate location of their underground utility lines with either flags, paint, stakes or a combination of the above. They will also let you know if they have no lines in the proposed excavation site.

Step 3:

Respect the marks. Update your request if work is not started within 10 working days or if marks are no longer visible. The digging safety zone is a strip of land two feet on either side of the underground utility line. Remember to include the width of the line.

Step 4:

Dig with care. When digging in the safety zone, you must determine the exact location of the buried utility line by digging test holes by hand. If damage occurs, even if it's just a scratch, notify the affected facility, utility or pipeline immediately. If the damage causes hazardous gas or liquid to escape, you must also notify the police and fire department immediately. Don't backfill in the damaged area until repairs have been made.
